Vegetable Production Resources For Your Garden Brooke Beam, Ph.D.

The Hop Yard Pest Management video is one of the numerous online resources available to gardeners and hops growers.

At the start of June, many individuals have planted their gardens for 2018. However, as the growing season continues, you may need resources to help diagnose or identify anomalies with your garden crop. Brad Bergefurd, an Agriculture and Horticulture Specialist with Ohio State University Extension, provided several resource recommendations for gardeners, described below.

Knott's Handbook for Vegetable Growers, by Donald N. Maynard and George J. Hochmuth, is a book that covers production tips for many vegetables. Topics covered in the book include transplant production, greenhouse production, soil and fertilizer recommendations, and pest management. Two other resources for vegetable production in the Midwest include the Midwest Vegetable Production Guide for Commercial Growers and Midwest Fruit Pest Management Guide 2018. Both of the Midwest guides were generated from collaborative efforts from 16 universities and Extension Services in the Midwest region. The guides provide specific recommendations for individual crops, pollination, weed management, and pest control. The guides are available for free online.
