Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) is a set of production guidelines designed to reduce the likelihood of microbial or other contamination of fresh fruits and vegetables. Producers will learn the best practices that will reduce the risk of their product becoming contaminated. Upon completion of this class the farmer receives a GAP Training Certificate issued by the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. The certificate is a component of the requirements to allow raw product samples at Kentucky Farmers' Markets and Kentucky Farm Bureau Certified Roadside Markets.

This class will be taught by Sarah M Stolz an extension agent specializing in horticulture for the Campbell Cooperative Extension Office. For more information and to register, contact Sarah at sarah.stolz@uky.edu or (859) 572-2600, and remember class size is limited. Registration required.
