The Ohio Corriedale Club will award two Corriedale ewes to a 4-H or FFA member that is interested in starting a flock of Corriedale sheep.

The applicant must follow these guidelines:

1. The applicant must complete an application with an essay answering the questions below.
2. All ewes must be managed by the recipient with the assistance and approval of parents or guardians.
3. The recipient must be of 4-H or FFA age the year the ewes are awarded.
4. The recipient must provide adequate facilities and feed for the ewes.
5. The recipient of the ewes or immediate family members must not own Corriedale sheep at the time of application.
6. The recipient should keep the ewes for at least two lambing seasons.
7. The ewes should be a part of the 4-H or FFA member's project and be exhibited at least at the Junior Fair Sheep Show at the Ohio State Fair in Columbus during the year the ewes are awarded.

The Ohio Corriedale Club will deliver the ewes to the winner and register the ewes in the member's name before May 1 of the current year. Ohio Corriedale Club members will provide management assistance, if requested by the recipient. A representative of the Ohio Corriedale Club may inspect the facilities or the project during the first year.

Applicants should complete this form and write an essay answering the following questions on a separate sheet:

- Why do you want sheep as a project?
- What facilities do you have to care for the ewes?
- Who do you have to help with the care and management of the ewes?
- What other experience have you had caring for livestock or animals?
- What are your future plans for developing a Corriedale flock?
- Is your family aware of the requirements for feeding and caring for the ewes?
- Is it possible for you exhibit the ewes at the Ohio State Fair Junior Corriedale Show in 2019?

The Little International is a showmanship contest sponsored by Wilmington College Collegiate 4-H to help participants improve their showmanship skills. There will be four age divisions: Beginner (ages 9-10 years old), Junior (ages 11-12 years old), Intermediate (ages 13-16 years old) and Senior (ages 17-21 years old). Up to four species can be chosen: Beef Cattle, Equine, Goats, and Sheep. Participants can choose to show all four species or pick only a specific species. However, it is a great learning experience to show all four species. All animals and show equipment will be provided on the day of the show.

Please mail all pre-registration forms to Wilmington College no later than March 31, 2019. Registration the day of the show will begin at 7:00AM and close at 8:00AM. Show management reserves the right to close any class or species division due to excess enrollment at any time. A demonstration of each species will be from 8:00AM-9:00AM followed directly by the start of the show. The event will last the majority of the day, depending on the number of participants.

Ribbons will be awarded to the top three contestants in each species. Banners will be given to an overall and runner up contestants in each species.
